Mission Statement

The Phoenix Community Learning Center (PCLC) is an inclusive school dedicated to increased learning and achievement of all students and focused on developing higher order thinking skills in all content areas. Through character education and strong staff, student, family, and community involvement, our students will become responsible citizens who make positive contributions to their community – now and in the future.

Philosophy

The educational philosophy of the Phoenix Community Learning Center (PCLC) is that students learn best when they are consistently challenged to develop and use their higher order thinking skills (Pogrow, 2008) through inquiry based projects. We believe that a curriculum focused on mastery in all content areas, but designed to challenge students to develop skills related to inquiry, critical thinking, problem solving, reflection, collaboration, and ethics and work habits is needed if students are to become true lifelong learners. We believe that not only must students learn these skills; they must apply these skills and knowledge at high levels if they are to be perceived as successful learners according to state standards.

At the PCLC, we believe that these thinking skills should be brought to the forefront of the curriculum and used as a guide for teachers in ensuring that students know how to apply and use the learned information and facts from content. This stance aligns well with the school's mission of focusing on higher order thinking skills in all content areas. Research has shown that integrating higher order thinking skills into the curriculum has been notably successful in accelerating students K-8 in all respects. When higher order thinking skills were taught, students' developed intellectually and socially, and their test scores grew dramatically-all without additional teaching to the test.

Professional Learning Community

Professional development and collegiality are essential to our school culture. The PCLC community of teacher learners participate daily in activities that promote individual and collective professional growth. Innovations and current research are shared to improve teaching methods and rigorous instruction that supports 21st century learners. As a Professional Learning Community, the administrators, teachers, and staff at the Phoenix have worked toward developing the following:

- collective inquiry
- collaborative teams
- action orientation and experimentation
- continuous improvement
- results orientations






ANNUAL REPORT FY14 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) student 2013-2014 enrollment is higher than FY13.






2013-2014

higher than projected.






78% of Revenues for FY14 were derived from State Formula (Foundation, PBA, SpEd and PA) payments.
