### A small group of community leaders set out to create opportunities in Columbus.

In 2006, community leaders set out to impact education in our City by bringing the KIPP network of high-performing, free, public, college preparatory schools to Ohio. Just two years later, KIPP Columbus began enrolling 5<sup>th</sup> graders from across the city, and opened the doors to KIPP Journey Academy in the Linden neighborhood of Northeast Columbus.

### A small group of students set out to change the trajectory of their lives.

That endeavor, now ten years old, has seen our founding class of fifty 5<sup>th</sup> grade students graduate from high school and matriculate to college campuses across the nation. From Vanderbilt to Clark Atlanta to Ohio State, those same 5<sup>th</sup> graders from 2008 are now juniors in college fulfilling dreams and bold ambitions of their families, our team, and themselves.

### A small group of educators set out to prove what is possible for children.

In those ten years, KIPP Columbus has grown exponentially to serve more than 2,000 students and alumni. We have launched over 100 community partnerships, enabling us to provide world-class facilities such as the Athletics and Wellness Complex and Battelle Environmental Center and amazing learning opportunities like the PAST Foundation offering students interactive STEM sessions and the Columbus Symphony bringing the gift of music. KIPP's expansion is both recognition of the impact we have in the community, and realization that we need more educational opportunities for children in Columbus. With over 2500 students on the waiting list, KIPP will continue to find ways to serve more students in the community.

### A small group of obstacles could not deter our belief...

The climb to and through college is not easy. However, nothing worth doing ever is. Our students persevere in spite of, and because of, any number of obstacles in their lives. Less than 10% of our 5<sup>th</sup> grade students enter KIPP reading on grade level. 100% of our children receive free meals at KIPP, and many of our children do not know when or if their next meal will come when they aren't at school. The majority of our students come to us from Linden – one of the most chronically underserved neighborhoods in our city.

### ...that we collectively will change the world.

In the midst of these inequities that are both infuriating and unjust, we have a responsibility and opportunity to shape the hearts and minds of our children. Our every action and effort can help our KIPPsters change the world and their place within it. By purposefully infusing every minute of our day with love, joy, passion, and purpose, we are helping children build the knowledge, skills, and character necessary for success in college and life. By creating a transformational education for our students, we are unlocking the opportunity for each student to live a life full of choice and meaning. And with it, we have no doubt that our children – ALL of our children – can and will change the world.





At KIPP Columbus, we understand that a singular focus on any one measure or assessment of the "health" of the school can create an incomplete picture of our success inside and outside the classroom.

The KIPP Foundation uses the Healthy Schools and Regions (HSR) framework to provide a holistic set of indicators by which we measure our progress.

At KIPP Columbus, we continuously guide and evaluate our effectiveness through testing, surveys, and personal feedback. Most importantly, we use "**The Six Essential Questions**" to provide a yardstick by which we can measure our school's progress and ensure we are focused on our mission and vision as we expand our impact.

### **KIPP COLUMBUS CAMPUS**

The KIPP Columbus campus includes an Early Learning Center, Elementary, Middle and High school. The 124-acre property has an environmental center focused on hands-on STEM education, generously donated by the Battelle. By the Fall of 2019, KIPP Columbus will open the Chlapaty Wellness Center, a 6,280 square-foot athletic facility.






### ARE WE SERVING THE CHILDREN WHO NEED US?

KIPP Columbus seeks to support the students who need us most in our community. To evaluate our effectiveness at achieving this directive, we track key demographic indicators of our students and focus our recruitment efforts on specific high-needs neighborhoods within the city of Columbus.

As an open-enrollment, public school, any child is able to attend KIPP Columbus, and there is no selection process. Students enroll at KIPP Columbus through a lottery system, and last year alone, there were over 2,000 students on the waiting list, with demand for quality seats exceeding our capacity.\*







Focus on character and academics Student achievement and growth at KIPP Columbus is tracked consistently throughout the academic year through a variety of internal and external assessments. KIPP Columbus is proud to share several highlights from our student academic performance from the 2017-2018 school year.



The 2017-2018 Value-Added data was the strongest KIPP Columbus has ever seen. **KIPP had 12x the amount of Academic Growth Required to receive an A** on the State Report Card, and our Progress (Value-Added) score remained high with an overall grade of an 'A,'





### OHIO STATE TEST

Beginning in 2015, each student at KIPP Columbus took the staterequired Ohio State Test. The results from this new test allow us to gauge our KIPPsters' academic progress compared to other schools in the region and state.

Notes: The red line above represents a Value-Added Composite Score of 2.0, which is the state's cut-off for earning an "A." A school district earn a C in Value-Added Growth would be meeting the average growth of the state of Ohio In 2016-2017, KIPP Columbus had a 19.29



For the 2nd year in a row, KIPP Columbus had the HIGHEST amount of student growth of ANY community school in the STATE OF OHIO. KIPP Columbus had the 15th highest amount of student growth across the state. That's 15th out of 3,424 schools in the entire state!


